

- Check in to the Courtyard by Marriott in Waco for a 2-night stay









YOU MAY EVEN GET TO GO INSIDE A HOME **DONE ON THE SHOW! Stops include JDH Iron** Design. Harp Design is permanently closed, but you will see the original shop and the Harp House. Visit the Magnolia Market & the Silos. Have lunch at one of the Food Trucks or Magnolia Table (owned by the Gaines) or another local eatery. Hop on the free Silo **District Trolley or the LaSalle-Circle Shuttle** (\$1.50 fee each way) and shop til you drop! **River Square Center is home to Spice Village** (shown on episodes of the Fixer Upper) that features many different vendors.








SIXTH FLOOR MUSEUM

The Texas School Book Depository building was the primary crime scene of JFK's assassination and is now home to the museum. You will see historic images, news footage, artifacts, and original evidentiary areas. The Corner Window exhibit or "sniper's perch" is accurately recreated based on crime scene photographs. Interactive touch-screens overlooking Dealey Plaza provide a unique and educational perspective of this historic site. Artifacts related to Oswald and Ruby include Lee Harvey Oswald's wedding ring, Jack Ruby's recognizable hat, and the camera used by the Dallas Times Herald photographer to capture the Pulitzer Prize-winning photo of the shooting.









GEORGE W. BUSH PRESIDENTIAL CENTER


The Bush Center combines the George W. Bush Presidential Museum and the forward-thinking George W. Bush Institute, focusing on universal opportunity, democracy, and free societies through policy solutions. It also houses the George W. Bush Presidential Library, preserving official documents and artifacts from the administration.

On the morning of September 11, Laura Bush was on Capitol Hill, where she had been invited to brief the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions.










































TULSA, OKLAHOMA

the second-largest city in Oklahoma with around 1 million residents, Tulsa was once the "oil capital of the world." 
WILL ROGERS MEMORIAL MUSEUM


The Will Rogers Memorial Museum in Claremore features art and artifacts pertaining to the life of Oklahoma's favorite son, Will Rogers. Explore 12 galleries in the expansive 16,652 sq. ft. museum and you'll find countless photographs and manuscripts documenting Will Rogers' life as a trick roper, Vaudeville performer, movie star, radio commentator, newspaper columnist, author, and philosopher. See original artwork by Charles Russell, Jo Davidson, Electra Waggoner, Wayne **Cooper, Charles Banks Wilson and Count Tamburini. Classic Will Rogers movies** also play in the museum daily.















PHILBROOK MUSEUM OF ART





















Day 7: Tuesday, May 7, 2024 – Pioneer Woman and Pawhuska


